Performing Nasopharyngeal Swabs


Equipment:

- 1. Gloves
- 2. Gown
- 3. Goggles
- 4. N95 Mask
- 5. Face Shield

Applies to:
EMT
Paramedic

Procedure:

- 1. Open the specimen collection kit.
- 2. Ask the individual to remove his/her surgical mask to perform the procedure and have them replace it when done.
- 3. The distance from the individual's nose to the ear gives an estimate of the distance the swab should be inserted.
- 4. Have the individual tilt his/her head back gently.
- 5. Steady their head by placing your hand on their chin with your non-dominant hand.
- 6. Insert the swab into the nostril straight back (not upwards) and back to the nasopharynx.
- 7. Leave the swab in for a few seconds.
- 8. Slowly withdraw swab with a rotating motion.
- 9. If possible, do the other nostril with the same swab.
- 10. Place the swab immediately into the sterile vial.
- 11. Break off or bend the end of the applicator shaft to close the vial tightly.
- 12. Ensure that the vial displays the individual's name, specimen source (Nose), date obtained and your initials.
- 13. This is general guidance on the procedure of nasopharyngeal swabbing. Specimen collection may vary slightly based on manufacturer or testing lab specifications. Please defer to those testing specifications when appropriate.



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
