SUBJECT: Expanded Treat and Refer Administrative Bulletin

This bulletin supersedes previous treat and refer guidance and is applicable to all low acuity patients. Individual agencies will be responsible for meeting assessment and documentation obligations memorialized below.

The governor and county health officer have declared a State of Emergency. As the COVID-19 situation develops, it becomes necessary to plan and prepare for the possibility that the emergency medical system in Contra Costa County may become overwhelmed. The triage of transport is one strategy to help mitigate the impacts. Many low acuity patients that activate the 911 system do not require evaluation/treatment in the emergency department and a significant percentage of them don't require emergency ambulance transport. In the spirit of preserving precious prehospital resources and preventing undue burden on our emergency departments, the following guideline shall be effective immediately and last until rescinded by the Contra Costa EMS Medical Director.

- Treat and Refer shall be expanded to allow accredited 911 Contra Costa paramedics to determine low acuity patients (with or without respiratory/viral illness) that do not require emergency department care and/or do not need ambulance transport to get there.
- Qualification is based on a thorough ALS assessment including a complete set of vital signs.
- The following principle should be used by the paramedic in their decision making:
 - How concerned are you about the patient's medical condition?
- If a low acuity patient has been identified, <u>request for transport may be declined</u> outright.
- When patients that qualify are identified, attempts can be made to refer patients to alternative health care venues and/or suggest alternative modes of transportation. A list of accompanying Contra Costa community clinics and advice line numbers is attached for field providers to disseminate.
- It is important that providers recognize and attempt to mitigate any bias in the decision-

making process. If a qualifying patient does not appear to have the ability to successfully navigate a referral and still desires transport the ED, strong consideration should be made to facilitate the patient's request depending on the urgency of the patient's condition and the status/capacity of emergency medical system at the time of contact.

- Documentation of Treat and Refer cases should include the following:
 - Vital signs and physical exam
 - Referral plan in the narrative
 - documentation of providing patient with printed resource material (see attached CoCo EMS "Treat and Refer" Resources)
 - ***Disposition documentation within PCR platforms is being developed for tracking purposes. This will be implemented when complete and will be communicated to all agencies when it becomes operational.
- Treat & Refer cases will be reviewed by the agency's appropriate clinical coordinator for quality assurance.
