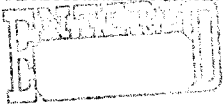

REPORT:

Approximately 21:09, CCHSHMP received a page from COMM-1. COMM-1 stated that there were two victims exposed to Malathion. One victim had a skin exposure, and one victim had a fume exposure. COMM-1 stated there was one bottle containing Malathion and did not know how much was in the bottle. COMM-1 requested HazMat team to be on scene.

At approximately 21:49, HazMat 1 and 3 were enroute to the scene. At 22:11, HazMat 1 and 3 were on scene. CCHSHMP established the staging area. CCHSHMP met Lieutenant Ian Herbert, Deputy Sheriff-Vanessa Moschetti, and Sergeant Laurie Bailey. Lt. Herbert stated that at approximately 20:40 on January 22, 2016, Ms. Kathy Wood called the Sheriff stating that someone placed the unknown bottle into the plastic bag near her trash containers. Her son, Arion Salazar, got the chemical on his skin when he touched the bottle 2 days ago. Ms. Wood said that Mr. Salazar's skin was burned due to the exposure. Ms. Wood was also exposed and smelled the chemical. At about 20:55, Deputy Sheriff Vanessa Moschetti was on scene. Ms. Moschetti suspected the chemical inside the bottle was Malathion. Ms. Moschetti was exposed to Malathion when she touched a bottle. The Malathion was on Ms. Moschetti's gloves and shirt. CCHSHMP investigated the scene, identified and confirmed that the chemical inside the bottle was Malathion. CCHSHMP placed the Malathion bottle, approximately 250 mL, and the contaminated debris into 2x5-Gallon poly-containers. CCHSHMP advised the Sheriff that individuals should seek medical attention or see medical personnel if they were exposed to Malathion and experienced side effects. CCHSHMP picked up the Malathion bottle and contaminated debris, but the Malathion smell can linger in the area. At approximately 23:06, CCHSHMP notified and left a voice mail message to Contra Costa County Agriculture about the incident. CCHSHMP departed the scene at 23:15.
