REPORT:

On September 23, 2019 at 12:32 PM, CCHSHMP received a request for assistance from Concord Police Department to remove suspected carfentanyl contaminated items from a residence after a person overdosed. CCHSHMP referred the request to Con Fire and responded with Con Fire, arriving on scene at 1:49 PM. According to Concord PD and Con Fire personnel, friends and/or relatives of the deceased had been in the residence cleaning up and had placed the suspected carfentanyl contaminated items in bags, so Con Fire placed these items in a 5 gallon bucket along with PPE (gloves) and paper towels used for clean up and removed the items from the residence. Concord PD stated that there was a "manipulable" amount of suspected carfentanyl with the contaminated items.

CCHSHMP was asked to provide assistance with disposal of the carfentanyl contaminated items as Concord PD has a policy that they do not handle these materials if they are not being used as evidence in a case. CCHSHMP attempted to contact a number of agencies (DTSC, DEA Lab, County Sheriff) for assistance with disposal prior to transporting the material back to the CCHSHMP hazardous materials storage area. CCHSHMP overpacked the 5 gallon bucket in a 5 gallon steel container prior to placing it in the locked hazardous materials storage unit. Concord PD Detective Greg Mahan contacted CCHSHMP at approximately 4:30 PM on September 23, 2019 and stated that they had done further investigating and now needed to retrieve the carfentanyl contaminated items for further testing. Detective Mahan took custody of the 5 gallon steel container at approximately 1:30 PM on September 24, 2019.
