Evelyn moved and Peggy seconded. Discussion:

Lauren asked for clarification on the motion.

Peggy asked if the two CJ motions could be put together and Evelyn said they couldn't.

Carole asked where money comes from? Evelyn: That is administrative work. If it can serve 30, why not 40? Sam asked if the CJ Committee collaborated with the BH Court.

Evelyn: this motion is focusing on what the MHSA Plan has. They have a budget for 30. Wants them to decide if there is enough for 40.

Teresa: Not sure she can support the motion because of concern over where the money is coming from.

Jerome: We looked at it from the perspective of the need that exists and how that need can be met. Our recommendation is they find the money because of the need.

Teresa: Appreciates that, but I believe I need not only be an advocate but it's important for us to think of where the money comes from.

Louis: Take a look around – everything is about money, but if we don't do something to slow what's happening down it will fall apart. Money shouldn't be the issue.

Evelyn: She is also a member of the MHSA/F Committee and wants us to watch where the money comes from. It's up to the administration to find the money. We let MHCC squander money that could have been used properly. Now we have an opportunity where we are still in the planning stage. Maybe an amendment to say 30 for next 2 years and then 40 after that.

Teresa: Advocated for funding of BH Court, but wants to know where the money is coming from.

Carole: This is a "both/and." We need to advocate, but we need to know about the funding sources. How do we do the advocacy in a well-informed and collaborative way? She suggested we revisit it when we get the MHSA presentation.

Peggy: We need to know what the additional cost would be.

Jerome: Would it be equally important to know about the nature of the problem to be objective?

> Supervisor Mitchoff suggested that a Substitute Motion be made to continue the discussion after the MHSA PH.

Discussion: Evelyn said she is unable to attend the Public Hearing. It was decided to discuss it in the CJ meeting and then bring back to the July MHC.

Vote: Unanimous 13-0-0.

Motion to approve resolution to hire a Mental Health Clinical Specialist to be assigned to the Behavior Health Court. Moved by Evelyn and seconded by Jerome.

Discussion:

Teresa: She is aware of a lot of gaps. We don't have enough information to know if this is the priority. She would like to know from our leadership who are not here today what our needs are. Lauren: Did you all vote on this? What were your feelings about it? Jerome: Based on what Marty shared when she came to the meeting, and based on her training, the present set up is inadequate.

Colette: Having worked as a front line person, it's the person on the front lines who know best. Marty knows best. Teresa: She has asked for value stream mapping of our system for years. There are holes, but I don't know if this is a

priority. We have interns throughout our system providing services. Evelyn: I respect your role on the Commission; I just want to say we can be paralyzed by analysis. We have different committees so we can be focused on items of interest. We have been focused on this for months and don't know what other analysis we can do. We are being proactive. If we are to advocate to keep our mentally ill out of prisons, we need to advocate for more staff.

Jerome: Deductive approach. If the MHSA Plan is to go from 15-30, there is already a plan to hire a MH clinician. It doesn't make sense if they don't. Mitchoff: It's like a Christmas list. There are more needs than what we have resources for. I don't have a problem asking for this to go into the plan, because it is just a plan. It's not a problem passing this without a dollar amount attached, but would be better to know the whole cost.

Jerome: Likes analogy of Christmas list

Mitchoff: Maybe call it a grocery list

because they are essential Jerome: The need has to be considered along with the money. Evelyn said there are some built in limitation as to what we can do. We are charged with advocating for the members of the public and others make the financial decisions. If they are going from 18 to 30 with 1 MH Clinical Specialist it cannot be done.

Gina: Sheriff's do support BH Court. The extra staff can be funded through other means.

Teresa: The resolution is fine. The Minutes say funding is through Jail Mental Health.
